

## Short Adjectives

**One-syllable** and **Two-syllable** adjectives ending in **-y, -er, -w** take **-er** to form the **Comparative** and **-est** to form the **Superlative**

**One-syllable adjectives**      **Two-syllable adjectives ending in -y, -er, -w**

<b>Positive</b>	short	tall	thin	happy	clever	narrow
<b>Comparative</b>	shorter	taller	thinner	happier	cleverer	narrower
<b>Superlative</b>	shortest	tallest	thinnest	happiest	cleverest	narrowest

### Don't forget!

- Short adjectives ending in **consonant-vowel-consonant** **double** it before adding **-er/-est** e.g. fat-fatter-fattest, big-bigger, biggest
- Adjectives ending in **consonant-y** turn the **-y** into **-i** and then take the **-er/-est** e.g. easy-easier-easiest, funny-funnier-funniest

### Remember!

We use **than** in the Comparative  
e.g. Your car is **slower than** mine

We use **the.....in/of** in the Superlative  
e.g. August is **the hottest** month of the year.

## Long Adjectives

The rest of the adjectives –two-syllable and more - take **more** to form the **Comparative** and **most** to form the **Superlative**.


<b>Positive</b>	beautiful	interesting	famous
<b>Comparative</b>	more beautiful	more interesting	more famous
<b>Superlative</b>	most beautiful	most interesting	most famous
